"It's hard to describe the feelings I had when I heard Women of Hope on Christian radio speaking my language (Roma in Albania). I started crying. Since that day I have listened every week. I can say with all of my heart that this program has changed my life and made me a totally different person: a better wife, mother and friend.

For seven years my son and his wife were unable to have children. This is considered a great shame in our community. They went many times to the hospital and took many medicines, but nothing happened. Our family was under constant stress and both my son and daughter-in-law were completely desperate.

One day, the Women of Hope program shared the story of the woman with blood flow issues. She just touched the robe of the Lord Jesus and was healed. Inspired by this story, my son, his wife and I started to pray to the Lord to be blessed with a child. They stopped taking the medicines and simply trusted in God for a miracle to happen. After three months of praying every day, we discovered that my daughter-in-law was pregnant. God blessed them with a beautiful daughter, Samuela, the answer to our prayers. And, because this occurred, my husband also came to know Jesus Christ.

We are so thankful to God for these blessings. I am so happy to have found Women of Hope, which has been such a great encouragement for me and my entire family. I am especially happy that it is in our own language so that it is easy for us to understand."

While the details of the stories may differ, the underlying truth remains: in Christ, lives are eternally changed. God is using Project Hannah to speak this hope to hurting women worldwide. The lost are found, the blind see, the lame walk and the dead are raised to life. Christ conquers all circumstances with his hope, an anchor for every soul, firm and secure.

Changed from the inside out

Elly's problems stemmed from the baggage of her past. Since her parent's death when she was 10, Elly lived as if she were a prisoner. Debilitated by mental illness and longing for a sanctuary, she went to Sweden, but her dreams for her future were shattered. There was no place for her. The asylum process was so long, it made her sick. The doctors gave her lots of medicine, but it didn't help. She found herself a lonely outsider in the place she came for freedom.

Starving for acceptance, she went to church. Though she had been raised in a secularized Muslim environment, she felt neither Muslim nor Christian. One day, a hidden picture from her past came to mind – she had seen *The JESUS Film* with her parents. She remembered that when Jesus was hanging on the cross, her mother cried and said, "Look, they killed God." She asked to see the film and then watched it again and again. Realizing by accepting Jesus she would have true freedom, she prayed, thanking God that he received her as his child.

As she slept that night, she dreamed she was sitting in a dark garden, calling on God and asking why he did not help her. All at once the whole garden was flooded with light and in the open sky she saw Jesus. The next morning, she woke up healed from all her mental illnesses. She didn't need strong medicine or sleeping pills anymore. She continued to grow in her faith and was baptized.

Though Elly's difficult circumstances have not changed, Jesus changed her life from the inside out. Today, she walks with him and helps reach other refugees with the gospel. She was the inspiration for 'Hannah's House' in Sweden. Though not a physical place, 'Hannah's House' is a gathering in locations like a coffee shop which provides a time of emotional shelter for refugees and introduces them to Jesus.

In the potter's hands

Excerpt from Founder Marli Spieker's story told in Chapter 1 of *When Hope Wins:*

... In that moment, my little car became a sanctuary. I felt as though God was sitting in the passenger's seat staring at me! I came to my senses. In tears, I relinquished all my rights, my plans and my will to him. 'Yes, I am the clay, Lord.' And in my mind and heart I knew that clay does not rebel; clay does not have plan A, B, and C; clay does not talk back to its maker! It simply abandons itself to the shaping of the potter's hands. I thought I was a flexible person. I was willing to go back and forth to Asia as many times as needed. We had sold our house so that we could use the mortgage payments to provide for my personal expenses traveling with Edmund. I had left behind family, church, personal comforts . . . but God did not want my "flexibility." He wanted my "pliability;" my total abandonment to his will and his skillful hands to shape me according to his plan-not mine! So, after thirty-two years of missionary service, I found myself surrendering my life anew to his sovereign will.

Since Project Hannah's beginning, we have strived to scale cultural, religious, social, and racial barriers using these two powerful tools superpower radio and high-power prayer. God is using our efforts and taking women out of darkness into the light of Jesus . . . and hope wins all over the world!

More than words

"Do you really think you can change women's plight?" people often ask me. I answer, "Together with his church and by God's grace – you bet I do!" I see it happening every day as I watch Project Hannah's teams responding to God's call to love as he loves, introducing Jesus to women everywhere!

God's purposes and universal call to goodness echo in every human heart. But for his follower, there is even more – he lovingly prepares good works for us in advance. Project Hannah (PH) teams are walking in such good works and their efforts are magnificent, albeit difficult. They do this not because of the daunting need before them, but because of the "small voice behind them" leading the way. This holy exercise of trust, obedience and faith in God is rewarded with the joy of being his "agents of change" in these troubled women's lives.

Jesus invites us to defend the weak and live out his love in humility, integrity and simplicity. We need to look beyond our sanitized lives and be willing to touch the wounds of this hurting world. Millions of brokenhearted women face unthinkable abuse and injustices. They gasp for hope, healing and real love with every breath. If we refuse to share with them in their pain, why do we expect them to listen to us when we share the gospel with them?

In my book *When Hope Wins*, I tell stories of God's transforming grace through PH teams. But ten chapters simply can't contain all God is doing as these women visit patients in AIDS wards in Angola; widow's huts in Cambodia; fistula hospitals in Ethiopia; prisons in Asia, Europe and South America; filthy brothels in Nepal and as they teach life skills, set up microbusinesses and open 'Hannah's Houses.' When women's lives are changed, they change their environmental conditions and the cycle of hopelessness is broken. I've seen women crawl out of the pit of despair and walk with Jesus into a new life of dignity. Transformed by his power and the love of others, they become God's agents of change themselves. Amazing grace, indeed!

Karen Mains' call to the Church resonates deeply in my heart: "Oh, that Christians understood that the Church is a birthing place, where life is encouraged in the middle of this death-camp world . . . a place where we can do spiritual labor within its shelter; a place where the agony of becoming is overseen by experts and awaited by concerned friends . . . a place where we participate in one another's travail and where we share joy and exhaustion when our work is successfully accomplished. The Church must be a place where mercy is given before judgment."
